

Scarborough Harbour Bertholders

If you are interested in becoming a permanent berth holder at Scarborough Harbour then read on.

Situated on the north east coast, Scarborough Harbour consists of three piers enclosing an outer and inner harbour. It is a tidal harbour, which means that at low water on Mean Low Water Springs the harbour is figuratively dry.

Applying for a berth

All berthing is the responsibility of the Harbour Authority and can be obtained on receipt of a completed application form. We operate a waiting list procedure whereby a £25 deposit is taken and this is deducted from your first year harbour dues when a berth becomes available.

Berthing Contracts

All vessels within the harbour are required to have a signed berthing contract. This must be signed by all partners in the vessel. Only upon receipt of a signed berthing contract will a space within the harbour be allocated to you.

Each berthing contract will run to 31 March when a new contract must be signed for the following year. Please take full note of and comply with the Berthing Conditions.

Berthing

Inner harbour pontoon moorings are available in 8, 10 and 12 metre berths.

Outer Harbour pontoon moorings are located in the south-west corner of the Harbour below the lighthouse. Vessels must be capable of taking the ground in a soft sandy bottom.

Outer Harbour Moorings consist of a mixture of alongside berthing for vessels of shallow draught that can take the bottom and cradle berthing for deeper draught fin keel yachts in harbour centre. (you will need to provide your own cradles and moorings)

Moorings Periods

The moorings run from 1 April to 31 March.

Fees and Charges

These are displayed on the notice board at the bottom of Harbour Office steps on West Pier and also available on the Council Website. They run from 1 April to 31 March

Access

If you are registered disabled and have any special requirements concerning berthing please notify the Harbour Office.

Harbour Dues

This charge is applicable to all vessels within the harbour limits and run from 1 April to 31 March. They are payable by the owner of the vessel in full unsolicited – however it is usual practice to be invoiced.

Inner Harbour Pontoon Access Gate

Security access cards/fob are available from the Harbour Office upon payment of a deposit.

Transfers

Berth holders requesting a transfer to some other berth are asked to submit their request in writing to the Harbour Office. It will be processed in strict order as from the date of the request and as and when a suitable berth becomes available.

Car Parking

Members of Scarborough Yacht Club are entitled to apply for a permit to park on the East Pier. Members of the Boat Anglers Club can apply for a permit to park in the trailer park. Public parking is available on the West Pier and Marine Drive.

Amenities

Three slipways are available for a mixture of uses, along with a repair and maintenance Grid and 'flat' for smaller vessels situated on the inner harbour with power supply and fresh water. A Crane is provided on the harbour. A 4 tonne SWL electric crane is available on the Vincent Pier for the use of Scarborough Harbour berth holders. A fee is charged for these facilities.

Refuse

Domestic refuse only can be placed in the bins provided around the harbour

Waste Oil

A waste oil tank is provided to all harbour users on the West Pier.

Fuel

Fuel is not available from the harbour authority.

Mooring Lines

Please ensure that your craft is properly secured with bow, stern and spring lines adequate to requirements.

Fire

Raise the alarm, contact Port Control or the Lighthouse during season where the Watchkeepers will contact the fire services if they have not already been called. Clear area of any people, particularly down wind of fire. Leave area in an orderly manner.

Pets

Please keep these on a lead and do not let them foul the berthing areas or footpaths.

Safety & Security

Please take note of the safety equipment provided and its location. A 24 hours watch keeping system employing CCTV surveillance is operated by the Harbour Authority for safety and security purposes.

Speed

All craft to maintain a slow speed with Harbour limits.
