Money for policing

You council tax bill includes a contribution towards North Yorkshire Police. Your Police and Crime Commissioner, Julia Mulligan, is responsible for setting the amount you pay. In a recent survey two out of three people said it should go up. In response she has increased it by 1.99 per cent – 8p a week more for the average Band D household.

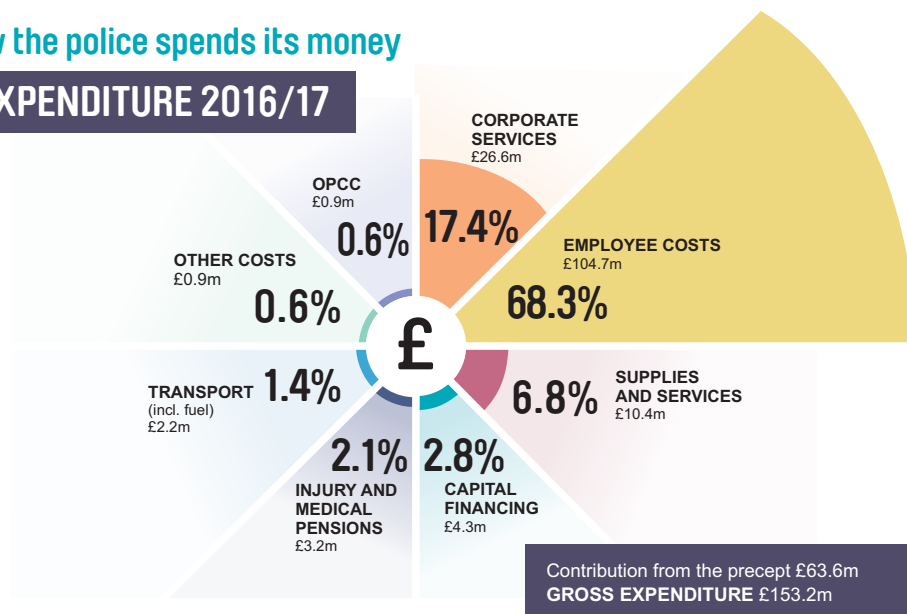
